"Giving Back to the Community"

While the K-9 Team's primary responsibilities are the safe apprehension of serious criminal offenders, the timely discovery of evidence, the protection of the public and officers, and the search for missing persons, they also serve as a link between the Police Department and the community. The Unit's current K-9's are trained not only on narcotic detection, but offender tracking and apprehension, building searches, and evidence locating.

Given the public perception and tangible link established by the K-9, between the department and the community, the K-9 officer is often times expected to participate in demonstrations, special events, and other exhibitions by the public. During these events, the K-9 officer is expected to use his/her K-9 to educate the community on its use; open a dialogue regarding K-9 operations and community expectations. The K-9 officer is also expected to seize opportunities to use the K-9 to open communication lines and increase understanding and knowledge in the community on a daily basis.

The Unit currently consists of four (8) teams made up of one officer and one K-9 each. These officers are assigned to the uniformed patrol division and work a rotational schedule, which allows for one or more of these units to be available at all times to aid not only the Panama City Beach Police Department, but surrounding agencies as well.

"Luncheon Reservations"

As we start a new fiscal year, it might be helpful to review the luncheon reservations and check in procedures. The Luncheons Committee has been working during the summer to arrange for the luncheon locations and speakers. The location and date for each luncheon is published in the yearbook (pages 8-9). It's easy to remember the date...always the first Thursday of the month, September through May.

The Telephone & Reservations Committee will email to each member the luncheon invitation about ten days before the luncheon. The luncheon invitation will contain all the details for that particular luncheon: date, time, location, speaker/program, menu, committee collections information and the deadline for your RSVP. The luncheon price will be the same for each luncheon this year: \$28. And you may pay with check payable to WCC, cash, or credit card. There is a \$1 fee for using credit card so credit card total would be \$29 for each luncheon.

Now your work begins! You will need to RSVP by the RSVP deadline time. For some luncheons you will have a menu choice to make and for all luncheons you will need to let us know that you are coming by the RSVP deadline time. Oh, did I mention there is a RSVP deadline time?!? Those times may vary slightly from luncheon to luncheon. That's because we have contracts with the venues that determine when they will need a final count and each venue has different requirements. Please note the RSVP deadline time for that luncheon and simply reply to that email. And we love having guests, so just include your guest's information when you RSVP. We will need each guest's name and menu choices. Once you have replied, you will get a confirmation that we have received your reservation.

Now it's time to check in. We have a lot of ladies registering in a very short time and we are trying to streamline the checkin process with two lines this year (as space at each venue will allow). If you are writing a check and can have it completed before you get to the desk, that would be helpful. Once you have checked in, please move into the luncheon area so we can continue to move ladies through the registration area as quickly as possible.

One last reminder that if you make a reservation and do not let us know by the RSVP deadline that you are subsequently unable to attend, you will be charged for that luncheon. This applies to any guests for which you are responsible also. We have contracted with the venue and given them a final count for which we are charged. And our By-Laws, Article IV, Section 1b include this process.

We are so excited for the upcoming venues and speakers this year! But we need your help getting check in completed. If we all work together we can get everyone, including the ladies at the check in desk, in the room before the meeting is called to order. See you soon!

The food pantry again has had a busy summer, with July having the most clients and meals given out EVER. It's a sad statistic, so hard to be proud of the number of individuals and families needing food assistance on the beach. However, through the generosity of our club and many individuals and corporations they, as with other food pantries on the beach, are able to continue to meet the need. In July the number of clients served was 326 and the number of meals given out was 2.934. I spoke to the coordinator of pantry volunteers and she said they are on course to serve as many this month.

The food pantry at Gulf Beach Presbyterian Church moved into a new location within the building that houses the pantry. With their move, in May, they now have more space not only for their stock items but they were able to add more freezers. With the additional freezers they now have room for frozen meats and individual or frozen family pack meals. In the past they only had freezer room for hot dogs or meat balls.

Like last year, at our business luncheon we will be collecting for the food pantry 3 times, in November, December, and May. Please read the Newsletter and your luncheon invitation for items requested / needed for the pantry.

Kirby Holt Christmas Showcase
